#### Our Curriculum Intent

Our Photography curriculum is ambitious, designed to offer exciting and stimulating opportunities to create, design and explore through this rapidly developing subject. At the heart of the course is the teaching of core skills, knowledge, concepts and values to enable all pupils to thrive. Spiralled and retrieval learning spans across all years and is supported by teacher expertise and self- regulated learning.

Equally important to the course is the development of inter-personal skills that will contribute to the development of resilient and well-rounded students. Students will learn how to adapt to change and accept responsibility for their progress. SEND and PP students are at the core of this planning.

We aim to enable students to be responsible, independent and confident photographers to enable them the best opportunity to reach their next stage of learning. Each student will be challenged to build on prior learning to adapt and apply their skills across a range of situations and disciplines. This gives students the best opportunity to showcase their talent and develop their skills with clear links to post-16 learning and employment in order to support their onward journey.

### Gold Standard Teaching and Learning in Photography

#### **Goal Orientated (Planning for Progress)**

- Starter Task- Self- directed lesson planning in every lesson.
- Blooms, learning objectives displayed clearly through flow of assessment and photography cycle.
